Dear Parents/caregivers

It has been a much more 'normal' start to Term 2 compared to the crazy start of Term 1!

Last week our Year 3 and Year 5 students all took part in NAPLAN. We are very proud of the amazing effort they put in. This week we are doing catch up tests with anyone who was absent. In 2023, NAPLAN will be brought forward to Term 1. NAPLAN tests students' skills in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar), and Numeracy. These tests will be done here at school and are considered part of the curriculum. It is important for you and your child to know that NAPLAN is not a pass/fail test. It simply looks at what level students are achieving in literacy and numeracy against National Standards and compared with student peers throughout Australia. Later in the year, we will send parents an individual student NAPLAN report that you can use to view and monitor how your child is progressing. If you have any concerns, you should speak to your child's teacher, as they know your child's learning best. We have noticed a number of students who are being dropped off at school well before 8:15am. 

PLEASE NOTE: Results of your application will be advised to you by Friday 12th August, Term 3.




SAPSASA CROSS COUNTRY Held on 13th May
